

We know how important communication is between home and school.

As a school we send messages to parents via email and text. We also encourage parents to like us on *Facebook*.

We send a link to our weekly newsletter to parents each Friday via email; the newsletter can also be accessed via the '<u>Weekly Newsletter</u> area on our school website.

We ask that all parents have a <u>*ParentPay*</u> account and that they ensure the school has their most up to date contact information (phone number and email address).

The vast majority of our communication to parents is sent home via email; we do not send home paper copies of letters unless they apply to a very small number of children, for example a sports team.

Copies of <u>letters</u> and other key information, as well as highlights of the children's learning, can be found on our website.

Children do best at school when there is an effective partnership between home and school. Please help us to ensure you stay up to date with what's happening at school by making sure you set up your *ParentPay* account before your child starts with us in September and that you inform us if your email address changes.





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School Uniform

By accepting a place at Hamstel Junior School, parents are agreeing to support their child in the wearing of correct uniform. This creates a calm environment in which children feel organised and prepared to learn. If children arrive at school without the correct uniform, the school may supply them with it for the duration of the day, and you may be contacted.

There are occasional non-uniform days throughout the year, usually linked to fundraising for specific causes.

Black or grey trousers / skirt

white polo shirt, maroon cardigan, maroon jumper or maroon sweatshirt. *Combined skirt/ trousers are not permitted*

Black or grey socks or tights

Flat heeled black shoes or plain black trainers (no logos please); no sandals

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Craft Activities

An apron to protect clothes during craft activities should be provided and kept in school - an old adult shirt worn backwards and the sleeves cut to an appropriate length is perfectly adequate. Please ensure there is a secure button in the top neck position.



PE Games and Swimming

All children are expected to change fully into the correct clothing for PE, games and swimming.

PE kit should be brought into school on the first day of term. It should then remain in school as the children will change into their kit on the days they have PE.



PE and Games

Each pupil will require a pair of plimsolls or trainers, a plain yellow t-shirt and maroon shorts.

Outdoor Games in Winter

It is advisable to provide either a tracksuit or a jumper.

Swimming

All children will require a costume, towel and swimming hat in a waterproof bag.

Swimming hats can be purchased via *ParentPay* and collected from the office. We ask that parents only buy a red hat if their child suffers from a medical conditions that warrants special care whilst in the pool e.g. asthma.

Not Permitted

Large trainer boots for PE or games, cycling or Bermuda shorts for either PE or swimming.

PE and swimming are part of the National Curriculum and all children participate in these subjects unless we receive a letter from their parents excusing them.

Jewellery and Earrings

Bracelets and necklaces should not be worn but children may wear a watch. In the interests of health and safety we ask that children with pierced ears only wear small studs. **ALL** earrings **MUST** be removed for PE, games and swimming lessons.

Hair

Children should not wear large bows or have designs shaved into their hair. In addition, children should not have dyed hair.

Please make sure that ALL items of clothing and personal belongings are clearly marked/ labelled with your child's name.



Extra - Curricular Opportunities

The school offers a range of extra curricular clubs and activities both before and after school.

Information about the autumn term clubs will be sent to all parents at the beginning of the new academic year.

Before and After School Provision

Our Breakfast Club and DASH club are open whenever children are in school.

Places must be booked and paid for in advance via *ParentPay*. Please see below for more information about each provision.

Breakfast Club

Our Breakfast Club is open to children from 7:45am in the Jubilee Dining Hall. For many of our children, arriving at school early and enjoying a healthy breakfast provides a positive start to the day, which in turn, helps to improve concentration, behaviour and educational attainment.

Places must be booked online in advance via *ParentPay*. There is a cost of **£4.00** per child.

Children should enter the club via the back door to the Jubilee Dining Hall between 7:45am and 7:55am. If a child arrives later than 7:55am they will need to enter via the main office.

DASH (Daily After School Hub)

Attending DASH gives children the chance to socialise with their peers as well as participate in a range of activities led by members of Hamstel staff.

Cost

The following costs apply:

- End of school until 4:30pm £5
- End of school until 5:00pm £7
- End of school until 5:45pm with a light tea (pick up from the Infant School) **£11**

Booking Information

Children should be collected at the appropriate finish time from either the main office (4:30pm & 5:00pm) or the infant main entrance (5:45pm).

Places should be booked and paid for in advance via *ParentPay*.

Please note, children can **only** be to be collected at the times specified above. If a child is picked up after 5:45pm there will be an additional charge of £5. A further £5 will be payable for any child picked up after 6:00pm.



Start of the Day

Children can enter the school via one of two entrances between 8:40am and 8:50am Most year 3 children come into school via the playground next to the Infant School. The gate to this playground opens at 8:30am; children should be supervised by an adult before 8:40am. Older children enter the school via the green gate next to the Junior bike store. Siblings may enter together via either entrance.

Children arriving at school after 8:50am must enter via the main entrance and will receive a late mark.

Late Pick Ups

Children should be collected at **3:20pm** from the playground (**3:25pm** for children in years 5 and 6). In exceptional circumstances, when a child is not collected on time, they are taken to the school office and parents are contacted. Parents incur a late fee of £5 if their child is not collected by 3:35pm and the school has not been made aware. A charge will also be made for any child who is regularly collected late.

Our Daily After School Hub (DASH) is available every day school is open; places should be booked in advance via *ParentPay*.

Accidents, Sickness, Medicines



We occasionally have to contact parents during the day and it is essential to have your work number or other emergency contact number on the Admissions Form. Emergency contacts should be people you trust to look after your child.

If your child needs medication at regular intervals, please arrange for them to have their medicine outside of school hours if possible. The office will accept prescribed medicines as long as they are in the original packaging with the pharmacist's label stating your child's name, the dosage instructions and expiry date. All medicines should be handed in to the school office where the relevant form will need to be completed and signed.

Asthma pumps are kept in the classrooms in a zip wallet with the child's name written on, in a class bag. Children are encouraged to self-administer and to be responsible for their own treatment. All staff are aware of the needs of asthma sufferers and will encourage children with asthma to participate fully in all aspects of school life. It is important the school has information about such children; parents should complete a school asthma card after discussion with their GP/ practice nurse. As parents it is your responsibility to check that your child's asthma pump is in date. If your child no longer suffers from asthma please notify the office so that we can amend your child's records.



Homework

Children do best at school when they are supported at home. We ask that children read every night and complete work which will support the acquisition of the key skills for reading, writing and maths. Reading should be recorded every evening in your child's Home School Diary.

The expectations for each year group are outlined below.

	Additional homework may also be set in the build up to the KS2 SATs and as part of the transition to secondary school.					

If you wish your child to complete additional work at home, they can access the sites on the <u>Educational Resources</u> area of our school website.

Home School Diary

Your child will be given a *Home School Diary* at the beginning of term. The diary is for them to record their daily reading as well as any other work they complete at home. It contains important information to help them learn their times tables, KIRFs and spellings.

Parents can also use the *Home School Diary* to pass on messages to the class teacher. Your child should let their teacher know if there is a message in their diary for them.



Hamstel Habits

At Hamstel Junior School we encourage our children to demonstrate the Hamstel Habits to help them be successful.

We ask that parents and carers support the school by talking to and encouraging their child to recognise when they have demonstrated these key skills.

The Hamstel Rights

The aim for all of us, parents and teachers, is for each child to become a well-motivated and self-disciplined member of our society. It is important for every child to learn to live and work with others, to enjoy both work and play and to behave in a safe and courteous manner whilst at school. The school seeks to maintain a hardworking and calm atmosphere based on the belief that children need to learn self-management of their emotions and conduct. Parents, carers and the school community share joint responsibility for ensuring children develop the skills to enable them to do this.

We encourage and expect all children to show consideration for themselves, other people and property and to use the 3 Rs as a basis for behaviour:

- The Right to be Safe
- The Right to Respect
 - The Right to Learn





Year 3 Curriculum

The National Curriculum

At Hamstel Junior School we follow the National Curriculum which was introduced in September 2014. Children are taught the three core subjects of English, mathematics and science. They are also taught the foundation subjects: history, geography, design and technology (D & T), physical education, computing, French, art and design, music and PSHE. Religious education is also taught through the locally agreed syllabus.

English

The development of children's skills for reading and writing is a high priority in the school.

Within English lessons, lessons across the curriculum, class reading sessions and, when appropriate, targeted interventions, we focus on developing three areas of reading:

- Becoming an expert decoder
- Reading for understanding
 - Reading for pleasure

Expert readers can become expert writers. The school takes a *Talk for Writing* approach to English which uses high quality texts as models for children's own writing. Each half term, children explore a selection of poetry, a work of fiction and a related non-fiction text. Teaching will involve a variety of styles with great emphasis being placed on the high quality of children's work.

Maths

At Hamstel Junior School we follow the *Maths No Problem* scheme. *Maths No Problem* is a maths scheme which is based on the mastery teaching approach; it is an approach to teaching maths which develops pupils' mathematical ability and confidence without having to resort to memorising procedures to pass tests - making mathematics more engaging and interesting.

A Connected Curriculum

The National Curriculum is often approached through topic-based, cross curricular lessons which encompass the core and foundation subjects in a relevant and meaningful way. We plan a range of trips over the year and welcome a number of visitors to the school.

School Meals

All school meals, and places for Breakfast Club, need to be booked in advance using our online system - <u>ParentPay</u>. Please ensure you have set up a ParentPay account as we are unable to accept cash payments. Those in receipt of free school meals <u>must</u> also book their child's school dinners online.

We are a large school and it is important that monies are paid promptly. **We do not give credit.** Where families are in receipt of universal tax credit or income support they may find themselves eligible for free school meals. If you think you are eligible, visit <u>Southend</u> <u>City Council's website</u> for more information.

If you wish, your child can eat their own packed lunch at lunchtime. Your child should have a drink as part of their packed lunch; however, for safety reasons, we do not allow hot drinks and ask that you do not send glass or other breakable containers in to school. Packed lunches should not contain bars of chocolate or sweets and we do not allow canned or fizzy drinks.

We aim to be a '**nut free**' school so please make sure that your child's snack or lunch does not include any food containing nuts.

Packed lunch boxes should be labelled with your child's name and class.

If you wish your child to come home for lunch a form must be completed and signed in advance. The form can be obtained from the school office and a new form must be completed each week.

Break Times

Children may bring a small snack to eat at break time. A piece of fruit or healthy snack bar is ideal. We do not allow bars of chocolate or sweets.

Water

Children should have a named water bottle in school, which they will be able to refill with water during the course of the day. *Please be aware that we only allow water in the bottles the children keep in class.*

Children may have a different drink e.g. flavoured water, to drink at playtime and lunchtime but this should be in a different bottle or disposable carton.

Mobile Phones

We do not allow children to have a mobile phone in school. Any phones found in school will be handed in to the office and will need to be collected by an adult.

Online Bookings and Payments

All payments and bookings are made via <u>*ParentPay*</u>. In order to make any payments and bookings parents will need to set up an account.

A ParentPay account is needed to book and / or pay for the following:

- School meals
- Breakfast club
 - DASH
 - School trips
- Before and after school activities
 - Music lessons

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In order to set up a *ParentPay* account you will need a letter and code provided by the school.

Forms to be completed

- Admissions Form
- School Trip Permission Form
- Online Safety and IT Permission Form
 - Medicines Form (if applicable)

These forms should be completed and handed in to the office as soon as your child starts at the school in September.

Medicines (if required), including asthma pumps and spacers should be handed in to the school office staff at the beginning of the autumn term.
