MAKE IT FUN

Questions such as how many weeks/days until the summer holiday/somebody's birthday? What day is Christmas day? What day comes after the 30th April? What day comes before 1st February? Make your own calendar.

How long is a minute? Ask your child to sit with their eyes closed for exactly one minute whilst you time them. Can they guess the length of a minute?

Carry out different activities for one minute, for example how many times can they jump in sixty seconds?
