Dear Parent/Carer,

We would like to inform you of a change to the way we share photographs of children through our school website and newsletter.

Following recent guidance regarding the online publication of children's images, we will be taking additional steps to ensure that any photographs displayed publicly are carefully selected to minimise the potential for misuse. As a result, the number and type of photographs shared on the school website may be more limited than in previous years.

We understand how important it is for families to see and celebrate the many experiences that children enjoy during their time at school, including educational visits, special events, performances, class assemblies and everyday learning activities. To enable us to continue sharing these moments with you, we will provide parents and carers with access to a secure online gallery through which photographs can be viewed throughout the academic year.

In the coming days, we will send home the link and password for your child's year group gallery, allowing you to access photographs of the activities and events that your child takes part in during the school year.

We kindly ask that any photographs accessed through this link are viewed for personal use only and are not downloaded, copied or shared on social media or other online platforms. This will help us protect the privacy and safety of all children while still allowing families to enjoy and celebrate their achievements and experiences.

Parents and carers who do not wish their child to appear in these photographs may still opt out by contacting the school office. We will ensure that any existing preferences regarding photography and image use continue to be respected.
