## Year 5 Transition to Secondary School

Dear Parent/Carer,

The time is fast approaching when parents and carers of children in year 5 will need to start thinking about the next step in their education – the move to secondary school.

### Secondary School Applications

The [Transition](#) area on our school website includes useful links to help you explore the secondary school options available locally. We recommend that you visit as many secondary schools as possible and attend their open days to find out more about what they offer. Parents will be able to apply for a secondary school place between 1<sup>st</sup> September and 31<sup>st</sup> October.

### 11+

[CSSE \(The Consortium of Selective Schools in Essex\)](#) has its own website for parents considering a selective school for their child. Notes on the 11+ process also appear at the end of this letter.

### 11+ Familiarisation Sessions

This year, we will be continuing our face-to-face familiarisation sessions after school. Please note – these are familiarisation sessions and *not* extra lessons. As places in these sessions are limited, we are offering those children who are interested in joining the sessions an opportunity to sit a past paper over the next couple of weeks. We will then send you the results together with an offer of a place at the familiarisation sessions **should your child score highly enough to be in with a chance of passing the 11+ test.** English sessions will run every Tuesday for 5 weeks, starting on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> April whilst the maths sessions will run every Thursday for 5 weeks starting on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> June.

We are also offering a set of 3 workbooks at a reduced price £13.50 to support any familiarisation work your child does at home. Once ordered, we will then ask for payment via *ParentPay*.

In early September we will also run a mock 11+ test to familiarise the children with the timings and conditions they will face when sitting the 11+. The test will not be marked but we will spend a couple of sessions going through the answers.

## Year 5 11+ Notes

These notes are designed to support the information available from CSSE.

### What is the 11+?

The 11+ is a series of tests sat by children to gain a place in year 7 at several local schools. The purpose of the 11+ test is to select the children who have the **potential to thrive** in an environment which provides a **highly academic** curriculum and a range of **challenging** pursuits.

- English Test
  - 60 minutes plus 10 minutes reading time
  - 60 marks
- Maths Test
  - 60 minutes
  - 60 marks
- Weighted 50% each



Age standardised

No verbal reasoning

Tests are deliberately hard

### Is a place at one of these schools the right choice for my child?

Does your child have the following qualities?

- A curiosity and enjoyment of learning and problem solving
- Perseverance and the ability to complete challenging tasks
- Understanding of all concepts taught at primary school
- Enjoyment of a wide range of literature and/or non-fiction texts
- Creativity in sustained writing
- Ability to make connections between various areas of knowledge
- Good memory
- Imagination and original ideas
- Ability to work at pace and assimilate information quickly

### Headteachers of CSSE Schools believe that children should also:

- Have a sound understanding of the National Curriculum in maths and English (secure)
- Be familiar with reading and responding to texts which require a reading age of greater than 11
- Understand the rudiments of spelling, grammar and punctuation

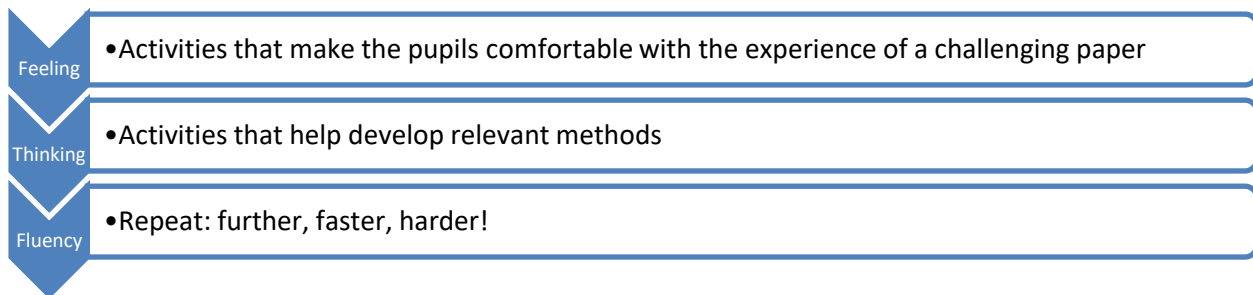
### To tutor or not to tutor?

Whilst it is advisable for children to spend a few hours familiarising themselves with the style of responses required in the papers, this can be done at home, using materials that are available. Headteachers at the CSSE schools share a concern that extensive coaching for the 11+ is inappropriate, ultimately counterproductive and may jeopardise a child's ability to cope with the demands of a highly academic curriculum.

- 21<sup>st</sup> September 2024 (Saturday) – 11+ test day
