

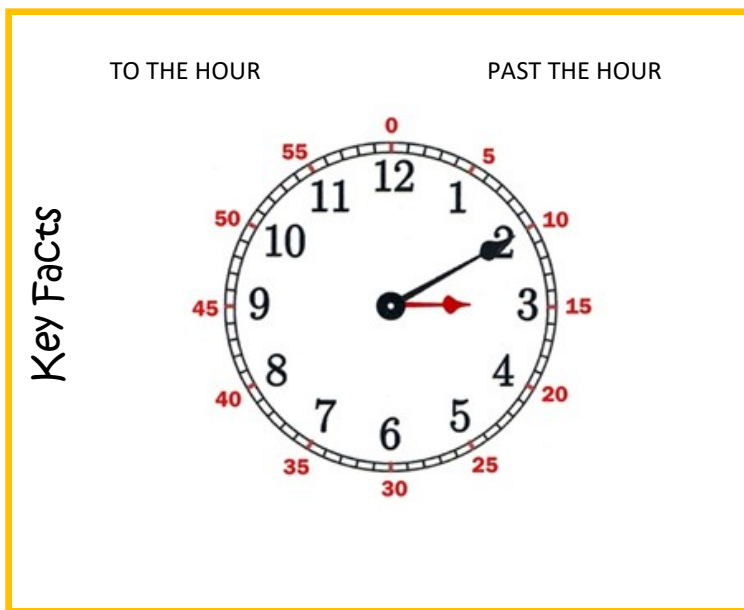
Key Instant Recall Facts
